

Frank Baum the magical shoes were silver, but when 16 year-old Judy Garland got the role of Dorothy Gale she preferred to have bright red (ruby) slippers. If you look closely at the image on the left you will see that the shoes that she wore were actually covered in sequins and that is what made them sparkle in the movie. Another fun fact is that the shoes were size 5.
