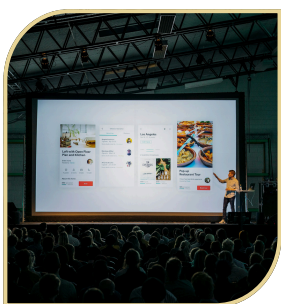
Stock Market (Year 6 - 8)
