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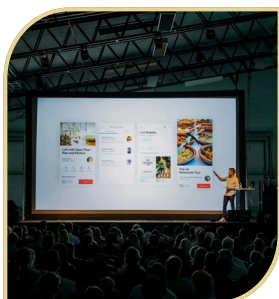
Science Club (Year 6 - 8)

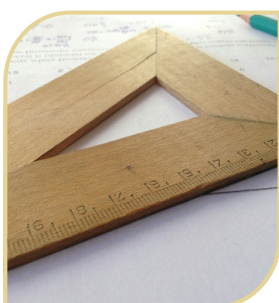
STEM (Year 5 - 8)

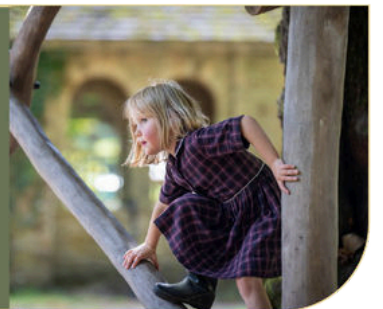


Construction club is super crafty. You can make all sorts of stuff and it makes me enjoy the afternoon and it just makes me feel so peaceful.
