Construction (Rec - Year 2)

Construction offers an exciting opportunity to explore creativity through hands-on building activities. Each week, children will listen to a story and then take on a construction challenge inspired by the tale. Using a variety of materials such as Lego, Mobilo, Duplo, wooden blocks, and junk modelling, the children will bring the story to life through their imaginative constructions. This club will encourage problem-solving, teamwork, and the development of fine motor skills, all while having fun with friends.



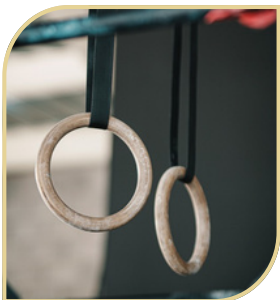
Larks Choir (Year 1 - 2)

The Larks Choir is a vibrant choir where children explore the joy of singing through playful activities and simple songs. The choir focuses on building confidence, developing listening skills, and fostering teamwork. Through rehearsals and performances, young singers not only learn musical skills but also cultivate a lifelong appreciation for music and the arts in a supportive and nurturing environment.



Forest School Club (Rec - Year 2)

Forest School Club is a fun, outdoor club where children can explore, play and learn through nature. Activities include den building, climbing, minibeast hunting, natural crafts and fire safety. Children develop confidence, independence, resilience and teamwork while discovering and enjoying the natural world. Children will also have opportunities to learn about fire safety and enjoy time around the fire, listening, sharing stories and developing patience, concentration and responsibility.



Gymnastics Club (Rec - Year 2)

Gymnastics is an exciting activity where children can develop strength, coordination, and agility using trampettes and springboards. Through engaging routines that include jumps, flips, and balance exercises, students will build confidence and teamwork.

Prep Activities



Art Club (Year 3 - 8)

Art club is open to all those keen artists who love being creative. Maybe they would like more time to complete their class work or to start a personal project. We may also have group projects on the go or a themed creative activity. It's a relaxed, inspiring space where pupils can experiment, build confidence and enjoy making art together.



Art Scholarship

Art scholarship is invite only for children with a real interest in art and who wish to explore developing their own portfolio. This experience would be ideal for those aspiring to consider a senior school art scholarship application. It provides focused guidance, mentorship, and opportunities to refine skills while building a strong, personal body of work.



Bridewell Choir (Year 5 - 8)

The auditioned Bridewell Choir gives singers the chance to perform in a formal, musically rich environment. Auditions ensure strong vocal skill and commitment, with rehearsals focused on technique, ensemble performance, and interpreting traditional repertoire. Members refine their musicianship through dedicated practice, performing hymns, anthems, and sacred works that enrich worship services and special events.



Cross Country Club (Year 3 - 8)

We will enjoy cross-country every Monday morning, after half term. It promises great fitness training and a high energy start to the week. Whether beginners or experienced runners, all are welcome to join and get the week off to a great start!



DT Club (Year 3 - 4)

DT Club is an exciting opportunity to explore design and technology through hands-on projects. Children will learn how to use a variety of tools safely and effectively while working with different materials, from wood and metal to textiles and plastics.

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Football Club (Year 3 - 7)

Football offers children a fantastic opportunity to release energy and enjoy structured gameplay on the astro. Unlike casual 'lunch-time kickabouts', this club provides a more organised experience, with small-sided games designed to enhance skills and teamwork. Each week, children will be grouped into age-appropriate teams, fostering a sense of camaraderie and healthy competition.

Prepare for success with these additional French CE sessions. Designed to help children build confidence and excel, this comprehensive program ensures that all the key areas are covered.



Lego Club (Year 3 - 6)

Lego brings children together to explore creativity, engineering and teamwork through hands-on building. The club offers challenges, collaborative projects and themed competitions, helping pupils develop imagination and problem-solving skills. From skyscrapers and robots to fantastical worlds, children build with confidence and creativity. Lego inspires innovation, collaboration and endless fun.



Netball Club (Year 5 - 8)

Netball provides fun and inclusive approach to the sport and is open to all levels of ability to strengthen skills and confidence. This session allows children to develop hand-eye coordination, spacial awareness, reaction time, fitness and all important teamwork and friendship.



Nightingales Choir (Year 3 - 4)

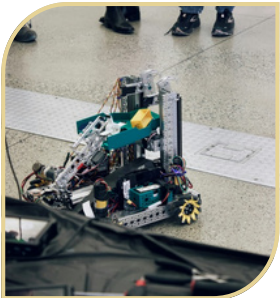

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Recorder Club 1 (Year 5 - 6), Recorder Club 2 (Year 3 - 4)

Recorder club is a great choice for children in Year 4, with or without previous experience of playing. Easy to learn, the recorder is a super instrument to help children learn to read music, explore rhythm and pitch and practice posture and performance.



Robotics Club (Year 5 - 8)

The Robotics Club gives pupils in Years 5–8 the chance to design, build, and program robots using the VEX IQ system. Working in teams, pupils develop problem-solving, coding, and engineering skills while preparing for fun challenges and competitions. The club encourages creativity, teamwork, and resilience as pupils bring their ideas to life in the robotics arena.



Touch Typing Club (Year 3 - 5)

We are excited to offer an after-school Touch Typing Club for children in Years 3–5 using Nessy Fingers. Suitable for both beginners and those looking to improve their typing skills, the programme helps children learn the keyboard through fun games while practising real words and spelling. Children work at their own pace, building confidence, accuracy and speed, with activities designed to adapt to their individual ability.



Trivium Club (Year 4 - 8)

Trivium returns to help students reach new heights in debate and public speaking. Using fun and engaging themes, participants explore knowledge, dialectic, and rhetoric while developing persuasive communication skills. The club encourages critical thinking, quick reasoning, and teamwork, making it a real confidence builder. Whether presenting ideas, challenging viewpoints, or refining delivery, students leave feeling more articulate, poised, and ready to express themselves with clarity and flair.



Woodland Wonder Club (Year 3 - 8)

A calm and relaxed opportunity to enjoy time outdoors and discover the natural world. Children will take part in simple woodland activities, nature challenges, observation games and gentle exploration, developing their curiosity and appreciation for the environment along the way. A small, informal club for children who enjoy being outdoors, noticing the little things and exploring at their own pace.
